Ashley Tomlinson Alumni Climber- Class of 1999

After graduating from Virginia Tech in 2007 with a BS degree in Psychology, Ashley found her passion in the field of mental health and worked at the bachelor's level with children experiencing severe emotional and behavioral challenges. This led to a Master of Social Work degree at the University of Chicago. Here, she had opportunities to work in clinical research and present at national conferences. With an MSW in hand, Ashley and her husband relocated to his hometown of Philadelphia, where she worked at the University of Pennsylvania on a research study focused on understanding the social/mental health implications of cutting-edge genomic technology. While interesting, she found herself tremendously missing the opportunity to work directly with children and their families and made the transition to school-based social work. Currently, she supervises a school-based team of social service professionals in the School District of Philadelphia and provides trauma-focused therapy. Her work also provides training to education professionals to promote trauma responsiveness in schools, helping teachers and school staff members understand the impact of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) and learn strategies for working with traumaimpacted children. Most recently, Ashley has launched a private psychotherapy practice. She is grateful to Jacob's Ladder for providing inspiration and perspective-broadening opportunities so early in her life and has fond memories of her time as a Climber, especially the enrichment courses and field trips. Ashley relates, "I think one of the things that had the biggest impact

on me was the theater class and the play we did (I love theater to this day.), as well as a really wonderful cooking class! I also took a class that involved field trips to sites around Virginia, such as the Richmond Holocaust Museum. The senior hiking trip at St. Mary's Trail was also really memorable. Mostly it was just great to be with other gifted kids and be encouraged to explore new interests. and splashing in the giant mud pit in the field at Christchurch School after a week of rain. I know that my family could not have afforded the experiences I had at Jacob's Ladder and am so thankful to have had the opportunity."
