# FROM THE EXEC'S DESK Catherine Coggeshall

We welcomed thirty-nine Climbers to St. Margaret's School for the 2023 Summer Enrichment Program during the first weekend of July, just in time to celebrate Independence Day. A week before the official opening of the Summer Enrichment Program, the eighth graders participated in the Senior Leadership Hike along Skyline Drive. The yearly camping trip includes daily hikes and time for self-reflection, developing team bonding, resilience, self-awareness, and developing leadership skills.

Encouraging Climbers to give back to the community is in the mission statement of Jacob's Ladder (JL). This summer, we saw this mission lived out as seven RAs and three summer program directors were Alumni Climbers.

Once camp officially started, our Climbers participated in eighteen hours of hands-on academic enrichment classes a week

taught by highly skilled teachers from across the state. These individuals are encouraged to select class topics they are passionate about, which allows for exploration of subject matter outside of typical classroom curriculum. Some of the classes included Neurographic Art, Action Anime, Mindfulness, Rappahannock River Critters, and Money Management. There were very few days where the weather didn't cooperate, allowing the Climbers to spend most of their afternoons and weekends outside. Jacob's Ladder considers swimming a necessary life skill. Each afternoon, Climbers take swimming

lessons as first-time swimmers or build on the water skills they learned the previous summer. This year, in addition to learning how to swim, our Climbers learned lifesaving skills. Being on



the Rappahannock River also allowed for frequent canoeing, fishing, and boating. Theatre is a large part of Jacob's Ladder. This summer, more than half of our Climbers participated in an adaptation of "High School Musical." Climbers devoted much of their time learning their lines, songs, and dances for the first two weeks of camp. In addition to this, our students had a chance to show off their skills by participating in coffee house and our talent show.

Each weekday, Climbers earn points for

meeting expectations throughout the day. There is a final points rewards trip that allows us to celebrate these accomplishments during their final week of camp. This summer, with the help of generous



donors, Climbers were able to take a trip to Water Country USA! Earlier in the month, we visited the Natural History Museum in Washington, D.C. Both were new experiences for most of our kids. It's going to be hard to top this summer next year!
